**Petition Summary:** This is a request to create a C-1 Conservancy lot by rezoning from A-1 Agricultural.

#### **Comments/Recommendations**

1. The buyer of an adjacent AR-1 lot intends to buy this lot and wants it zoned C-1 as a "buffer".
2. If approved, open space uses will be allowed but no development that requires a zoning permit.
3. The parent A-1 property will remain conforming.
4. The associated certified survey map has not been officially submitted for review.
5. The proposal is consistent with the adopted comprehensive plans as it will not involve any development and will retain the existing land use.

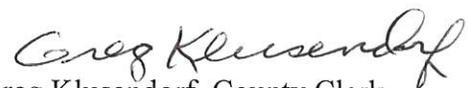

Long Term Care districts were formed when Family Care was created in Wisconsin. Crawford, Grant, Green, Iowa, Juneau, Lafayette, Richland and Sauk Counties formed our regional district. Southwest Family Care Alliance/ContinuUs provided family care services to our district. Wisconsin Act 215 authorized long term care districts to convert to private, non-profit corporations. In April 2016, ContinuUS's Board of Directors passed a resolution to jointly create a non-profit corporation and merge with two other long term care districts. In August 2016, DHS approved the creation of this non-profit corporation. In November 2016, DHS approved the transfer of assets and liabilities to the non-profit corporation. ContinuUs will cease active operations as of January 1, 2017 and begin winding down its organization and financial affairs. Each county in the long term care district is asked to pass a resolution to dissolve the long term care district.

**Dissolution of Long Term Care District Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 46.2895(13)**

**WHEREAS**, ContinuUs (formerly named Southwest Family Care Alliance) is a long-term care district formed by Crawford, Grant, Green, Iowa, Juneau, Lafayette, Richland and Sauk counties by resolution pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 46.2895 for purposes of delivering services as a managed care organization (MCO) under the State of Wisconsin's Family Care program; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2016, the Wisconsin State Legislature enacted 2015 Wisconsin Act 215 authorizing long-term care districts to convert to private, nonprofit corporations; and

**WHEREAS**, in April 2016, ContinuUs's Board of Directors passed a resolution to jointly create a non-profit corporation and merge operations with two other long-term care districts, Community Care Connections of Wisconsin ("CCCW") and Western Wisconsin Cares ("WWC"); and

**WHEREAS**, the non-profit corporation was created in August 2016 to succeed ContinuUs, CCCW and WWC following approval from the Department of Health Services (DHS); and

**WHEREAS**, in November 2016, DHS approved the transfer of the assets and liabilities of the three long-term care districts to the non-profit corporation and certified the corporation as an MCO effective January 1, 2017; and

**WHEREAS**, as of January 1, 2017, ContinuUs has no continuing business operations and undertakes no activities related to the purpose for which it was formed, which was to contract with DHS for the provision of Family Care services; and

**WHEREAS**, the final step of winding down ContinuUs's operations is the dissolution of the district, which requires joint action by ContinuUs's Board and the county boards that formed the district pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 46.2895(13); and

**WHEREAS**, this Resolution is intended to act as Iowa County's official action authorizing the dissolution of ContinuUs; and

**WHEREAS**, the Secretary of DHS may rely on this Resolution as action on the part of Iowa County authorizing dissolution of ContinuUs.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE IOWA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**, that Iowa County hereby authorizes dissolution of ContinuUs pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 46.2895(13).

**RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR NEW  
COUNTY NURSING HOME AND ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY**

**WHEREAS**, the Iowa County Board has created a Nursing Home/Assisted Living Committee to establish a non-profit organization that will build and manage the County's Nursing Home and Assisted Living Facility; and

**WHEREAS**, under the Nursing Home/Assisted Living Committee and County Board has adopted necessary paperwork for creating Prairie Village Care, Inc.; a non-profit organization; and

**WHEREAS**, the Nursing Home/Assisted Living Committee has identified a funding option available through United States Department of Agriculture-Rural Development called the "Direct Loan Program"; and

**WHEREAS**, the Direct Loan Program has specific requirements that must be met for the loan to be granted to Prairie Village Care, Inc.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Iowa County Board of Supervisors that Iowa County hereby expresses its support for providing the following financial commitments necessary to pursue funding from the Direct Loan Program:

1. That Prairie Village Care, Inc. be an independent non-profit that is not under the control of the County Board and does not have County Supervisors holding a majority of seats on its Board of Directors
2. That Iowa County contributes upfront a one million dollar commitment to the project in the form of cash, land, consultant fees, or other effort.
3. That Iowa County contributes six months of operating cash to Prairie Village Care, Inc. as determined by a feasibility study.
4. That Iowa County agrees to restrict fund balance dollars equal to one year's debt payment in order to cover any operating/debt repayment shortfall experienced by Prairie Village Care, Inc. for a period of three full years of operations.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Nursing Home/Assisted Living Committee shall provide an additional resolution with financial commitment specifics once the feasibility study is updated and additional information becomes available.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this resolution has been reviewed and agreed to by USDA-Rural Development and recommended by the Nursing Home/Assisted Living Committee.

## Where will the money come from?

1. That Prairie Village Care, Inc. be an independent non-profit that is not under the control of the County Board and does not have County Supervisors holding a majority of seats on its Board of Directors – NO \$ Impact
2. That Iowa County contributes upfront a one million dollar commitment to the project in the form of cash, land, consultant fees, or other effort. – In 2018 budget, the County will need to determine how much to budget for land costs. This will be out of the Capital Budget. The consultant fees and attorney's fees have all come from operating budgets annually.
3. That Iowa County contributes six months of operating cash to Prairie Village Care, Inc. as determined by a feasibility study. It is assumed that this will amount to close to three million dollars. Unsure where this will come from!! Can this be a loan that is repaid to the County in year 5 or 6?
4. That Iowa County restricts reserve funds equal to 45 days of cash on hand to ensure Prairie Village Care, Inc. can operate on its own. This reserve shall be maintained until such time that Prairie Village Care, Inc. develops a reserve fund that ensures a 1.25 debt service ratio. It is anticipated that a portion of our fund balance can be set aside to meet this requirement. Since we are not spending the money and simply designating it, a resolution by County Board should satisfy this requirement.
5. In addition there is around \$400,000 worth of banked time for current employees at Bloomfield. When those employees shift to private employment, will the County Pay them out?

6. Fees for independent consultants may not exceed the federal rate of \$650 per eight-hour day, unless prior approval is received from DOJ.
7. Reimbursement for travel (i.e. mileage, meals, and lodging) is limited to state rates.
8. Recipient fully understands DOJ has the right to suspend or terminate grant funds to any recipient that fails to conform to the requirements (special/general conditions and general operating policies) or that fails to comply with the terms and conditions of its grant award.
9. **Prior to release of funds, the recipient must forward copies of all contractual agreements to DOJ.**
