What is the Request to Standing Committees?

The Long-Range Planning Committee is asking Standing Committees to review information department heads have prioritized. From this information and additional dialogue, identify three strategic issues Iowa County needs to focus on in the future. The County Board appreciates the fact that committees play an essential role in identifying solutions to public concerns by addressing policies both present and future.

The Long-Range Planning Committee is looking for:

- Changes in how we can effectively deliver services in the next 10 years and what this model might include. We concur that immediate needs must be examined and addressed. Our current committees continue to focus thought, energy and action on those needs.
- Response to a question such as “What will be the biggest change(s) in the next 10 years that will need county support related to the specific standing committee?”
- Response to a question such as “What legislation and/or regulations do you see on the horizon that will impact Iowa County in the next 10 years?”

An example of this is the January 1, 2013 deadline for the county to have narrow-band emergency communication in place. This need and cost goes back to an FCC ruling in 1992 regarding the necessity of moving to narrow band emergency communication. The FCC is currently saying narrow band emergency communication will need to be cut in half again following the 2013 action.
