

RESOLUTION NO. 10 192

OPPOSING DOUBLE FAMILY HEALTH COVERAGE FOR COUNTY EMPLOYEES

WHEREAS, health insurance premiums are a large part of county payroll benefits; and

WHEREAS, it is presently possible for one family to be receiving family health insurance policies from more than one municipality or private business or to receive two family health policies from a single unit of government; and


WHEREAS, this practice does not result in higher health benefits to the insured(s), but does result in significant costs to the government(s) paying the premium.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Wisconsin Counties Association to go on record opposing the above practice; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Wisconsin Counties Association and it's membership thereof urging the 1993 Session of the Wisconsin Legislature to enact laws that will prevent such double health coverage for government employees.
