

Community Support Program (Adult Mental Illness)

The Community Support Program provides intensive treatment, support and rehabilitation for persons who have a serious mental illness. The program's goals include improving psychiatric stability, reducing the need for hospitalizations, reducing the stigmatizing effects of mental illness and promoting independence and community integration. The program also has a 24-hour crisis line: **800-362-5717**.

ELIGIBILITY

Am I Eligible? You may be eligible if you have a serious and persistent mental illness that is treatable.

BENEFITS

How Can The Program Help Me?

The Community Support Program offers:

- Crisis stabilization;
- Overall case management;
- Individual psychotherapy and medication management;
- Assistance with substance abuse and general medical needs;
- Advocacy, linkage and referral;
- Assistance with applying for entitlements and vocational training;
- Assistance with finding affordable housing;
- Social/recreational opportunities; and
- Support and education for family, friends and community members.

What Does The Program Cost? If you fit the eligibility criteria, the program is open to you regardless of your ability to pay.
